A Message from Father Martin

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God. (Hebrews 12:1-2)

Dear Friends,

We begin November with our celebration of All Saints. As we hear in the Hebrews passage above, we are surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses – saints in history, persons who have inspired us on our journeys, and friends who encourage us day by day. This cloud of ‘saints’ past and present encourage us to run the races that our lives and to look to Jesus, our leader/pioneer, our model of faithful human living, and our companion and friend.

I am glad to be running the race that is set before us at St. Andrew’s over these past two months. I am eager to see how God will inspire us in welcoming and supporting one another and in serving God’s people here in the San Lorenzo Valley and beyond.

All of us are needed in the race that is set before us – no one is intended to be on the sidelines. All of us are needed in the ministries of St. Andrew’s: our prayers, participation in Sunday worship, service ministries, and our pledges of financial support. Each of us serves as we are able, as we can, looking to Jesus who sees our potentials and possibilities and is excited by whatever we can offer. ORANGE EGG NOG

1 quart commercial egg nog
 1 ½ cups milk
 1 (16 oz.) can frozen orange juice concentrate, thawed
 ½ cup (or less) light rum
 1/4 cup (or less) orange-flavored liqueur
 ground nutmeg

In a large pitcher, mix egg nog, milk, orange juice, rum, and orange liqueur. Refrigerate for several hours or over night to blend flavors. Pour into small glasses and sprinkle with nutmeg and orange zest. (Or the orange zest can be added to the egg-nog when you make it.) For breakfast, I use very little of the liquors, just enough for flavor.

WINE GLOG

Combine: 1 quart hot water, 2 cups brown sugar, 1 teas. nutmeg, 4 sticks cinnamon, 24 whole cloves, 2 teaspoons Spice Islands orange peel or fresh orange zest. Bring to a boil and simmer 3 minutes. Add 1 gallon of red wine. Heat and serve.

A good way to heat this and keep it warm is in a crockpot.

Where will you be as polls close for U.S. midterm elections?

As polls begin to close on Nov. 8 for the U.S. midterm elections, all are invited to join an Election Day Prayers gathering online hosted by The Episcopal Church Office of Government Relations.

Tune in from 8 p.m. to midnight **EST** via [The Episcopal Public Policy Network Facebook](#) page or [The Episcopal Church Facebook](#) page. Viewers do not need a Facebook profile to participate.

At the top of each hour, special guests from around the church will offer 10-15 minutes of reflection and prayer. Participants are encouraged to engage in prayerful conversation in the comments. The gathering will also feature simple video feeds from parishes throughout the U.S.

Scheduled guests include Presiding Bishop Michael Curry; House of Deputies President Julia Ayala Harris; the Rev. Charles Graves IV, missionary for Houston Canterbury; the Rev. Donna Gleaves, an Episcopal Public Policy Network ambassador; and Willis H.A. Moore, an Episcopal Election Activator.

“We welcome everyone as we reflect on this key process of our common life and on the importance of fair elections for our democracy,” said Rebecca Linder Blachly, director of the Office of Government Relations. “We hope many voters will join us that day to pray for our leaders, neighbors, and country.”

To grow our outreach ministries, children's programs, and to continue our Interim Pastor's term until St. Andrew's can call a settled 1/2 time Rector.

Pledging for 2023

Pledges are confidential and may be changed at any time if your situation changes. We are encouraged in the Episcopal Church to give as a proportion of our income (rather than the same as last year). Please consider your monthly or annual income and what percentage reflects your gratitude and priorities. Our goal is 10% - a tithe - something to grow into. Every pledge is a good pledge.
